

# 2020 Annual Facility PREA Report

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## **In 2020, 137 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 5 reports received:**

- 0 Substantiated incidents
- 3 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 2 Unfounded incidents
- 0 Incidents reported which were not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

## **In 2019, 186 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 11 reports received:**

- 1 Substantiated incident
- 5 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 4 Unfounded incidents
- 1 Incident reported which was not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

## **In 2018, 150 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 7 reports received:**

- 0 Substantiated incidents
- 7 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 0 Unfounded incidents
- 0 Incidents reported which were not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

## **There were 3 unsubstantiated incidents in 2020:**

There were three unsubstantiated incidents in 2020, and one corrective action as a result. All staff were reminded about Pegasus' cell phone policy. Only the Core Staff or supervisor running the shift is allowed to have a cell phone on their person. Staff were also informed on the importance of demonstrating competency, prudent judgment and self-control in the presence of children and when performing assigned responsibilities at all times.

## **There were 0 substantiated incidents in 2020:**

There were 0 substantiated incidents in 2020, and no corrective actions as a result.

**Corrective action plans occur following every substantiated incident, and some unsubstantiated incidents where measures can be taken that can improve safety. Typical corrective action plans include:**

- Additional training on visual supervision practices, or a change in supervision practices, to include increased supervision efforts
  - Identification of barriers to adequate supervision and strategies to mitigate
  - Safety Contracts for the juveniles
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- Sanctions for juveniles identified to have engaged in sexual misconduct
- If appropriate, contact with law enforcement and/or human resources
